### Mission:


To lead the planning, development and support for high quality, innovative and accountable mental health and addiction services and strategies so that all Montgomery County residents achieve wellness.

Establish, to the extent resources are available, the following addiction & mental health services including:

- Emergency Services & Crisis Intervention
- Mental Health & Substance Use Disorder Outpatient Services
- Clinically Managed Substance Use Disorder Residential Treatment
- Substance Use Disorder Partial Hospitalization
- Substance Use Disorder Withdrawal management
- Recovery and other related supports
- Effective 9/15/2016 (ORC Ch. 340.033) An array of treatment & support services for all levels of opioid & co-occurring drug addiction

## CY19 ADAMHS Priorities: Treatment Services & Recovery Supports

- Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) & Integrated Dual Diagnosis Treatment (IDDT)
- Residential Withdrawal Management & Treatment (under 16 bed with ability to bill Medicaid for treatment services)
- Housing (Permanent Supportive Housing with wraparound services for those with severe & persistent mental illness & Recovery Housing)
- OhioMHAS Certified Peer Run Organizations
- OhioMHAS Certified Agencies who are integrating certified peer recovery supporters into treatment milieu
- Workforce Development for those in substance use recovery
- Services incorporating trauma informed approaches



- Requires a <u>separate application for funding</u> in the online portal for Level 3 recovery housing
- Do Not embed as a new program within an existing application
- Please send an email to Fred Tatum <u>ftatum@mcadamhs.org</u> to request a new AFF be added under your agency's name titled "Promise to Hope Recovery Housing"
- Joint project with MVH Hospital Promise to Hope program for women who are opiate addicted & pregnant
- Project guidelines are available today in hard copy and the ADAMHS application for funding online portal

## Licensure & Accreditation Requirement

Agencies requesting funding must meet at least one of the following:

- OhioMHAS licensure/certification for requested services
- National Accreditation (JCAHO, CARF, COA)
- Affiliate of NAMI Ohio
- Member of Ohio Recovery Housing who have or are willing to complete peer review process
- Governmental entity
- Education entities under the jurisdiction of the Ohio Department of Education or the Ohio Board of Regents



## Financial/Insurance

- Financial Audits
  - Changes:
    - All new recovery housing providers required to have audited financial statements or will be required to obtain Surety bond.
  - Requires upload of most recent audit
- Insurance
  - Will require updated policies prior to contract approval
- Accounting System
- Property/Procurement Standards
- Key Performance Indicators
- No changes to the Sliding Fee Scale
- Year-end Close Out: Final billing due 30 days after close of contract year.

## Quality Improvement Requirements

Quarterly QI reporting

- Outcomes jointly agreed upon through the AFF process by ADAMHS and the contracting agency;
- Submitted no-later than one month after the completion of the previous fiscal quarter;
- Must submit through web-based Survey Monkey portal.

Agency reviews

- Levy funded services;
- At minimum bi-annually

## Quality Improvement Requirements

### NEW CY19

E-Basis Perception of Care and Basis-24

- Distribute survey link throughout agency;
- E-Basis 8% to 10% submission rate standard of active staff per quarter;
- Perception of Care: 8% 10% submission rate standard of active clientele and case closures combined per quarter;
- Anticipated go-live date of January 1, 2019
  - Currently starting three phased group betatesting.

# Online Portal Application for Funding New Features for CY19

- Agencies responsible for adding key performance indicators for organization
- If an agency has multiple programs, each program will require an itemized budget
- A "I have reviewed this program" button for each program to ensure an agency staff person is reviewing the narrative for "ported" programs from year to year
- If an edit is requested by ADAMHS, it will no longer require "un-signing" the original application
- Ability to create a pdf or print just for a specific program or page



- Friday, September 14: Request a Login (if needed) at <u>https://apps.mcadamhs.org/</u>
- Monday, September 17 8:30 am: Portal goes live
- Friday, September 28 Application for Funding submissions are due by at 5 p.m.
- Oct Dec 2018 ADAMHS will be reviewing applications, scheduling agency meetings (when necessary), and sending notifications
